He was Directeur de Recherche at the Centre de Physique Théorique in Marseille France, and published over 60 scientific papers. Subsequently, he worked for many years on quantitative finance and risk management. His book on the subject includes a chapter on Climate Change Risk Management. He was Adjunct Professor at the Courant Institute, NYU. He did the math behind the Bloomberg Climate Clock and spoke on a panel at the 2015 Paris Climate Conference. He has been a long standing member of the NGO Committee on Sustainable Development-NY and honored to be their Lead Expert Adviser on Climate Change.
